Overview

Dengue remains one of the public health problems in Cambodia. With an annual **14.000 reported case**, Cambodia is one of the highest Dengue burdened countries in South-East Asia.


With an estimated intervals of 5-7 years, the worst dengue situation occurred in 2007 when 39,851 cases with 407 deaths were reported. Dengue outbreaks have occurred in almost 22 among 25 Provinces, due to improvement of accessibility and greater population movement.

The number of cases of dengue has seen an increase over the past 10 years.


As dengue **spreads to rural areas**, cases of severe dengue are being reported from remote rural areas.

Consequently, the **population at risk has increased from 3.5 million in the urban areas of Cambodia to almost 11 million.**

National Dengue Action Plan 2017-2021

National Dengue Action Plan 2017-2021 was developed with strong technical support from WHO.

The **Program overall objectives** is: **To reduce the case fatality due to dengue below** 0.1%

Main Specifics Objectives are:


1. To strengthen early diagnosis and clinical management;

2. To enhance epidemic preparedness and outbreak response capacity;

3. To implement selective and sustainable vector control through integrated vector management (IVM) system;

4. To develop a comprehensive IEC/ BCC package to be used in all media to raise awareness on the disease and change in behavior for environmental cleanliness.

Way Forward

- Strengthen National Dengue Control Program (NDCP) with adequate capacity and necessary administrative, technical and financial support for implementation, monitoring and evaluation of dengue control at central level
- > Identify key stakeholders to support dengue prevention and control activities
- > Develop capacity of medical professionals and supportive staff at national level
- Improve routine reporting via Health Management Information System (HMIS) for Dengue/ DHF
- > Develop a strong disease surveillance and outbreak response system
- > Develop and implement a comprehensive IEC/ BCC package
