

# FINAL SYMPOSIUM ECOMORE 2020-2021

### **Options:**

- Organization of one final symposium in a partner country gathering dengue and leptospirosis components and bringing together key scientists involved in the studies and regional external experts
- Organization of two final symposium, one on dengue, to be held in a country where dengue control study was implemented and one on leptospirosis in in a country where leptospirosis study was implemented
- Participation in major events organized in the region on dengue with several ECOMORE presentations (vector control in 3 countries, saliva test, epidemiology study, outbreak simulator, climate impact...)
- Organization of the International Leptospirosis Symposium (ILS) in Hanoi in collaboration with IPNC and IP-Spirochetes Biology Unit (who will organize?)
- Any other suggestion??

### Message of Ben Adler – President of ILS:

- We are already looking to the 2021 conference. Accordingly, proposals to host ILS 2021 are now invited. Any interested persons should email me directly to obtain a *pro forma* proposal form and the ILS Conference Guidelines. The deadline for submission is April 30th, 2019. This will allow some time to assess proposals such that an announcement can be made in Vancouver.
- Cyrille Goarant has already contacted Dr Ben Adler to evaluate if NIHE/Hanoi can be candidate and the reply is "Of course it would be feasible to hold ILS 2021 in Vietnam (I assume Hanoi?). It will depend on what other proposals we receive. The key point is to make the meeting affordable for scientists from poorer countries. In that regard, Vietnam, like the rest of South East Asia (apart from Singapore) has an advantage. In the past, some bids have been rejected because they wanted to hold the conference in fancy hotels, etc. On the negative side, I don't think Vietnam has had people at previous ILS conferences".
