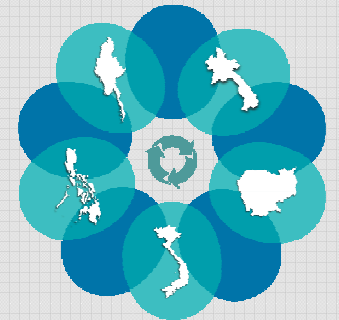

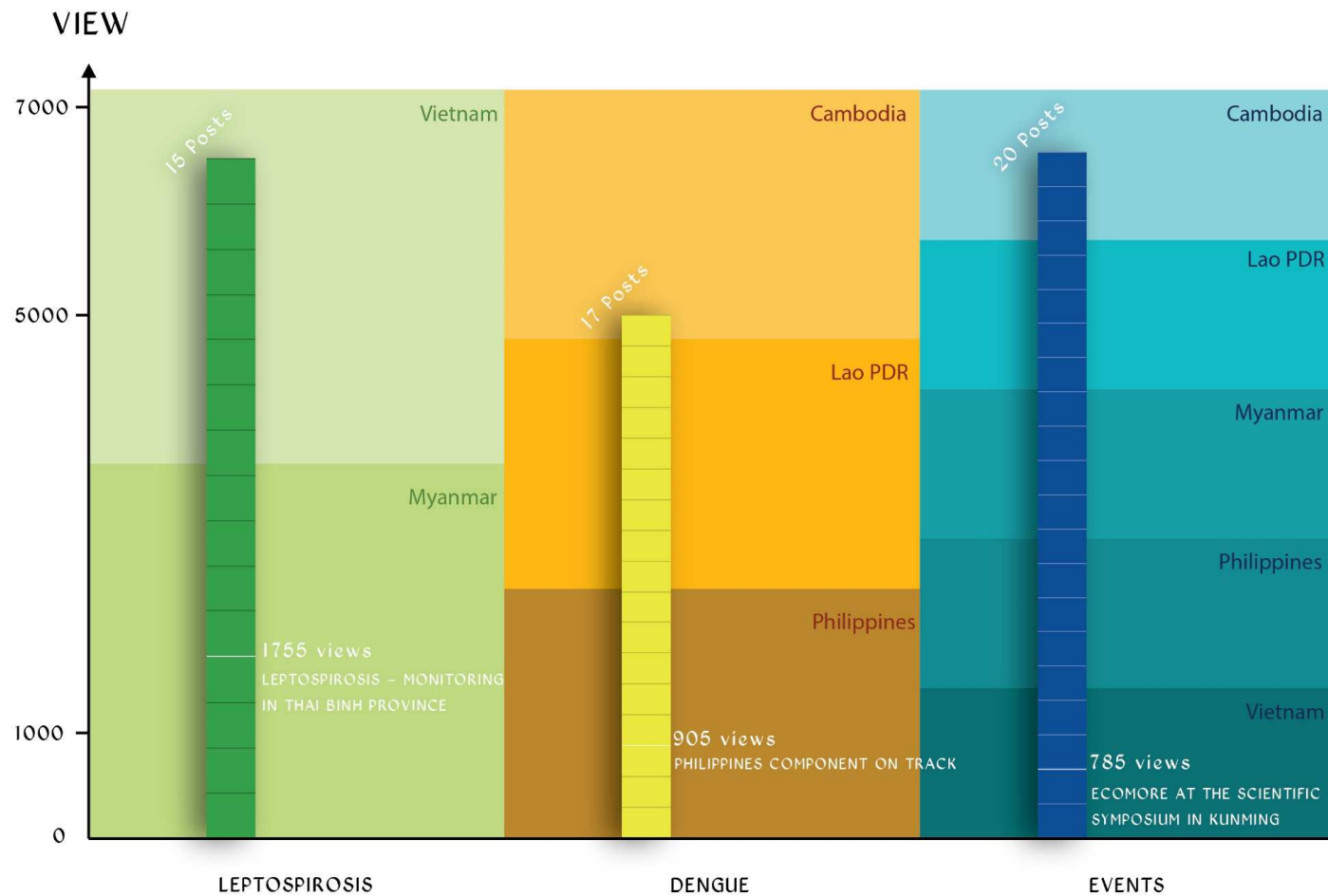

4. Trainings in 2019

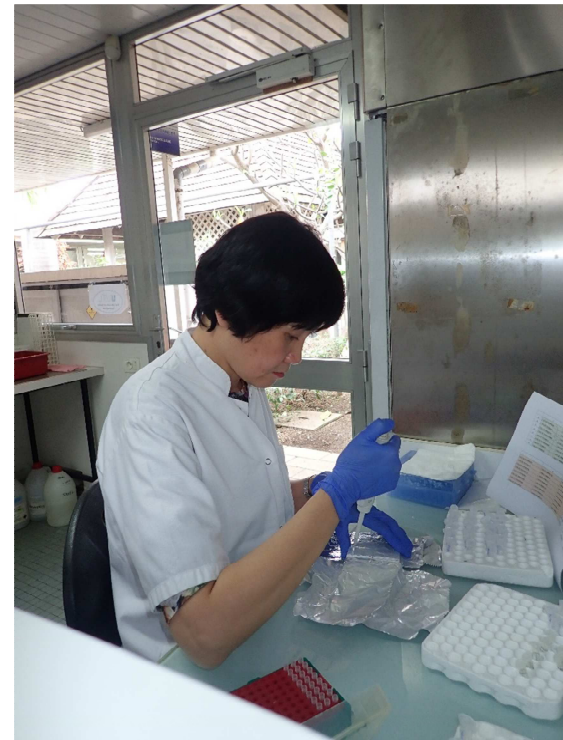
GIS in May 2019 at IPC

Real-time reverse transcriptase PCR (Rt-qPCR)



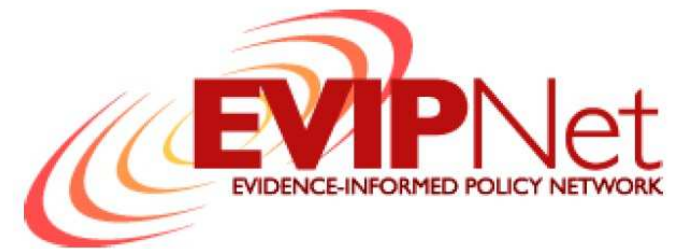
5. KT: Working Groups

- The principle of Working Groups is to bring together limited groups of decision-makers, influencers or potential users.
- The common difficulty encountered is to gather the group the same day because by definition these key persons are overloaded of meetings.
- Actually, it is confirmed that the KT must be tailored in each country: practical approach in Cambodia, Lao PDR, Myanmar, Philippines and Vietnam.



KT: How the ‘knowledge-to-action gap’ can be improved?

- The coordination must not be longer responsible of organization of the KT at the country level; it must be included in the Work-Plan and the Budget-Plan of each Partnership Agreement.
 - KT activities cannot be limited to events, even regular but must be a continuous approach from face to face meeting to more formal events.
 - The coordination must provide a simple reporting templates to follow-up all action which participate in the KT. One person must be dedicated for monitoring KT “events” in each Institutes.
 - The coordination supports the ECOMORE country teams to design this approach and to comply with the work-plan because **that in itself is unnatural for researchers to debate with decision makers or potential users.**
 - Actually, in public health the knowledge may not be a definite product or a clear recipe for action, but must raise awareness and get people thinking in new ways. KT should be referred to as *evidence-informed* policy-making and practice, rather than *evidence-based*.
- The limited scope of ECOMORE WPs impairs decision makers participation; it is suggested to link ECOMORE KT with WHO network.
 - The Evidence-Informed Policy Network (EVIPNet) is a network established by the WHO to promote the systematic use of research evidence in health policy-making





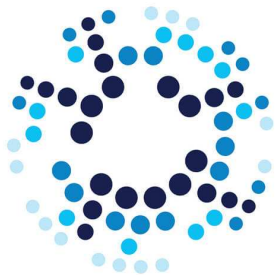

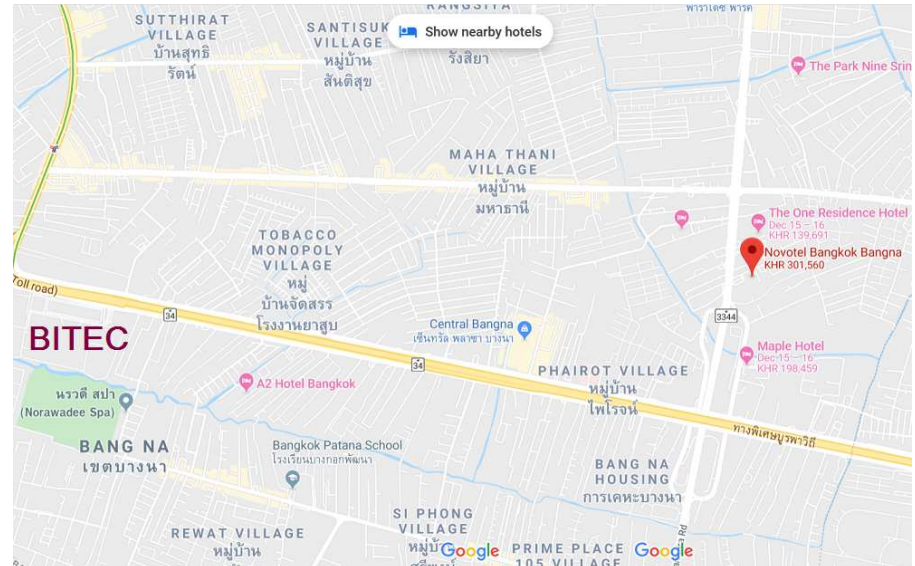

Option 2: side symposium during ICTMM

Option 3: Rotating Final Symposium

The final symposium will be held in the 5 partners countries

Leptospirosis

- 1 Symposium Lepto in Vietnam with participation of C.Goarant, Y.Supputtamongkol, 2NCs + data manager + lab tech + 2 key persons NHL: 2,000 USD (meeting Package for 50 people) + 8 accommodation- 1500 USD + plane tickets (1,500 regional and 2,000 NC) = 7,000 USD
- Un symposium Lepto in Myanmar with participation of C.Goarant, Y.Supputtamongkol, 3 NIHE + 3 Directors of hospital: 2,000 USD (meeting Package for 50 people) + 8 accommodation- 1500 USD + plane tickets (2,000 regional) = 5,500 USD

Dengue

- 1 Symposium Dengue in Cambodia with participation of 3 RITM, 3 IPL = 5,500 USD
- 1 Symposium Dengue in Lao PDR with participation of 3 RITM, 3 IPC = 5,500 USD
- 1 Symposium Dengue in Lao PDR with participation of 3 IPL, 3 IPC = 7,000 USD
- Goodies= 2,000 USD

TOTAL: 32,500 USD = 30,000€
